Eucharistic Retreat Weekend As Part of the Diocesan Year of the Eucharistic Revival in the United States, the Diocese of Wheeling/Charleston will host a Eucharistic Retreat. Faithful around the state are invited to attend a weekend to bring our hearts closer to Christ in the Eucharist. Keynote speaker: Fr. John Finnell. Cost per person is \$100. Ash Wednesday Special Collection On February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of southern Turkey and northwest Syria. The death toll has surpassed 20,000 and continues to climb. Thousands of people have been injured and many are trapped beneath the rubble. The earthquake is the worst to strike Turkey this century. Within the subsequent 24 hours, the region experienced multiple aftershocks and a second 7.5 magnitude quake. Catholic Relief Services is supporting local partners in their efforts to provide urgent relief and assistance for long-term recovery. CRS has partnerships with Caritas Turkey and Caritas Syria, as well as other local partners. To support the efforts of these organizations, Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and for collection baskets to remain available for the collection through the first Sunday of Lent. Bishop Brennan appreciates your generosity this past summer to those affected by the severe storms and flooding in Eastern Kentucky and Southern West Virginia. But he feels impelled once again to ask you to do what you can to help those affected by this most recent disaster. All funds collected in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will be given to Catholic Relief Services with the special designation for use in the Turkey/Syria Earthquake Recovery Effort.

History of Mardi Gras

As Catholic Christianity spread throughout Europe during the first millennium, different cultures celebrated the last day before Lent in their own ways, adapting the practices to suit their cultures. Mardi Gras was brought to the United States by the French, and the words themselves mean "Fat Tuesday." The idea was that the day before Ash Wednesday is the final day to eat meats and fatty foods before the penitential season of Lent, back when Lenten regulations regarding fasting from meat were much stricter than they are today. Mardi Gras ends abruptly at midnight, as Ash Wednesday and Lent begin. Then it's time for confession and penance.
