

Inspiration of the Week:

Jesus the Good Shepherd, knows that real love is an action, not an idea. His sacrifice is the proof of His love for His flock. Let us remember to love one another as the Good Shepherd loves us: not just in words, but in actions, in choices and in deeds.

Prayer of the Good Shepherd:

Dear Lord,

You are my Shepherd, a Good Shepherd, who leads in ways beyond my understanding. Guide me in the paths You would have me go. Amen.

Why do we sing in the middle of the Eucharistic Prayer: "Hosanna, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord?"

These are the words that were sung on Palm Sunday, when Jesus rode the donkey into Jerusalem, the custom for Jewish Kings (Mt 21, Mark 11, Like 19 & Jn 12). The crowd brought palm branches and shouted, "Hosanna to the King of Israel, the son of David. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!" Hosanna means, "save us, we ask you!" (Catechism 559). The people were asking Jesus to be their king and save them, Hosanna. So why do we sing these words of Palm Sunday during the Eucharistic liturgy? We sing to welcome Jesus, who comes to each Mass in the Eucharist to be truly present, to save us, help us and be our king. Each Eucharist, we remember Holy Week, including Palm Sunday's praises, Christ's offering of himself on the Cross and Christ's Resurrection Easter morning. The first written record of te liturgy outside the Bible includes the response after communion, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" (Didache, 10). So we know that repeating the Palm Sunday acclamation has long been a part of the Mass. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says in paragraph 559 and 570, says, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" is taken up by the church in the Eucharistic liturgy that introduces the memorial of the Lord's Passover of His death and Resurrection.

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston invites the public to a special prayer service at 4pm, Sunday, April 28, at Mt. Calvary Cemetery, 1685 National Road, Wheeling, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Benwood Mine disaster. The event will honor the lives of 119 men & boys, who lost their lives as a result of two explosions within the Wheeling Steel Coal Mine in Benwood on April 28, 1924. While the miners were from the surrounding communities on both side of the Ohio river the majority were immigrants from Poland, Greece, Italy, Russia, Hungry, Serbia, Croatia Lithuania and Ukraine. Notably, many were also Catholic, belonging to St. John Parish in Benwood and St. Ladislaus in South Wheeling. The memorial on April 28th this year will take place at the site at Mt. Calvary, where the largest mass burial in Wheeling ever took place. There are 65 buried at the mass grave, where the gravesite service was conducted in three languages. Seven other miners were buried together. Their names were Istavan Vargo, Ignac Orban and Sandor Horvath. Victims of the disaster including those miners who were burned beyond recognition were buried in a mass grave at Greenwood Cemetery across the street.
