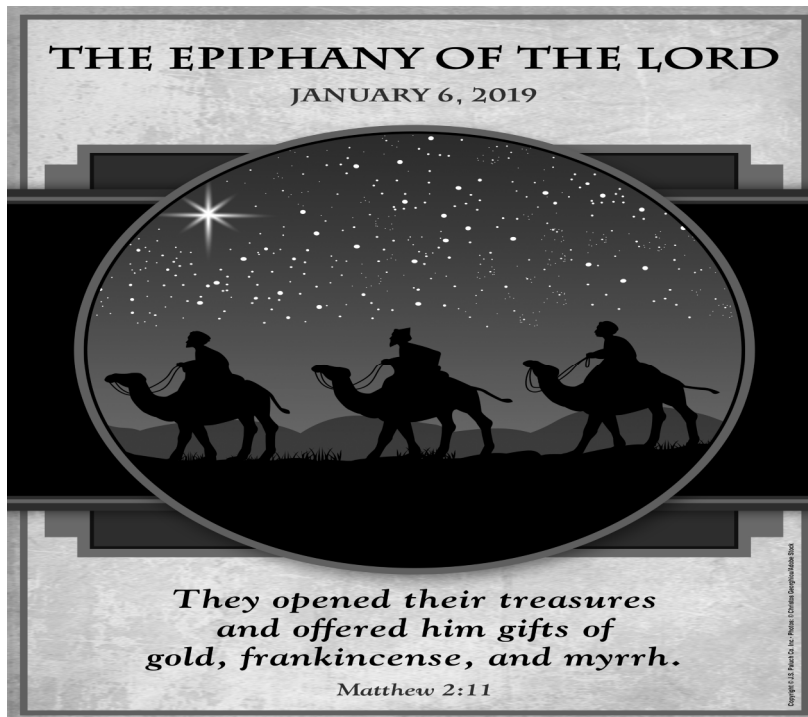

New Seminar on Adult Faith Formation!

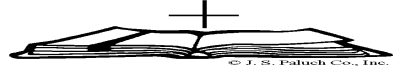
