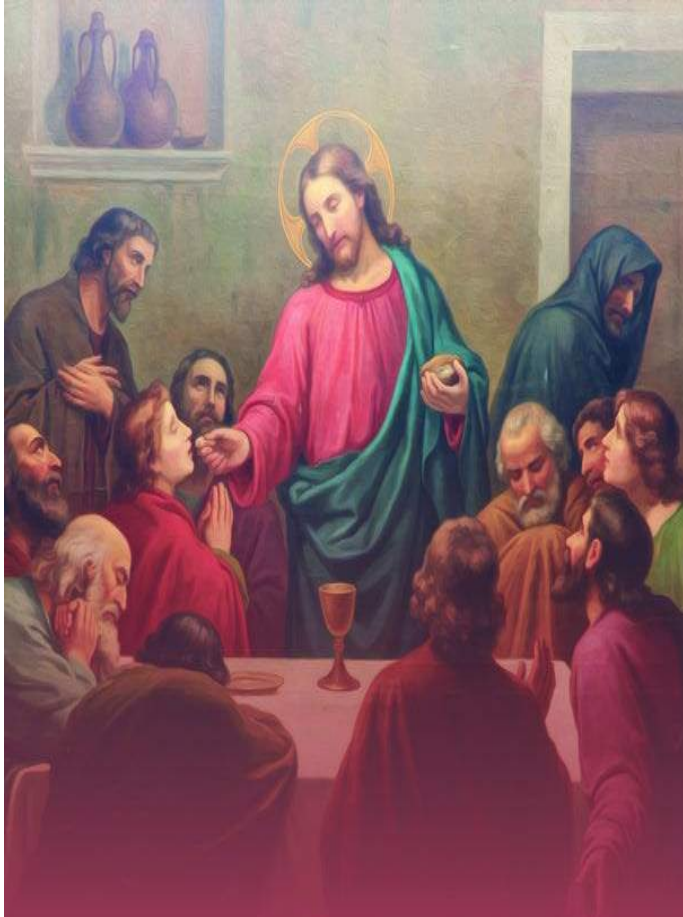

BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST



Why do we profess in the Creed, "I believe in the Holy Spirit who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified?"

There are many scriptures that talk about the Holy Spirit's relationship to the Father and the Son. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus speaks about working together with the Father and the Spirit when he says, "I will send you, the Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father" (John 15:26; 16:14-15). St. Paul wrote to the Galatians, "God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out, 'Abba, Father!'" (Galatians 4:6). St. Peter addresses his first letter to those "chosen and destined by God the Father and sanctified by the Spirit for obedience to Jesus Christ." And so in the Bible we see the Spirit working with the Father and the Son from the beginning of the Church, and the Catechism summarizes, "The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, is God, one and equal with the Father and the Son, of the same substance and also the same nature with the Father and the Son, he is worshipped and glorified" (CCC 245). And so, last Sunday, when we celebrated Pentecost, we celebrated that the first Christians were filled with the Holy Spirit, and that means they were filled with God. Each of us has also received God the Spirit during our baptism and confirmation. Whenever we profess the creed, we are reminded that the Holy Spirit is God and that God dwells in each of us. That is amazing!

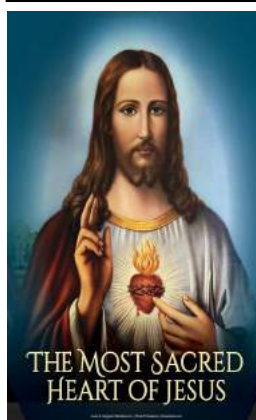
CATHOLIC SHARING APPEAL
