A Drastically Changing Environment

Todays celebration of the Passion of the Lord begins with a royal entry into Holy Week. The royal red, is not only a sign of the kingship of Christ, but also a morbid reminder of the blood He shed for the salvation of souls. This weekend's liturgies begin as a jubilant welcome, but quickly changed to a contemplative atmosphere as we reflect on the suffering and death of Christ. Likewise the altar and church grounds, festively adorned with palms, will soon be removed and replaced with symbols of the commemoration of the Lords Last Supper on Holy Thursday where we see the call to love. The Mass of the Lord's supper, Holy Thursday, requests a moderately, but solemnly decorated Altar. On this night, we enter into the Sacred Paschal Triduum; a time where three days are summed up in one! Time stands still. Note the emptied tabernacle and urn at the side of the church. These are symbols of Christ pouring out his love for us, urging us to empty our hearts and empty ourselves for the genuine love of others. May we reflect on how letting go of bitterness allows room in our heart for love of others. The empty baskets, to be filled with your generous donation of food, will hopefully overflow with food to be shared together as a family. By loving others, we love Christ. Upon entering the chapel of repose (located in the high school building), we see two red cloths draping the sides of the doors. These swags of red are representative of the red blood that marked the doorposts of believers at Passover. The stark and entirely empty church on Good Friday is bold sign that Jesus gave everything he had for our salvation. Good Friday is the only day of the entire year in which Mass is not said. No sacrament are celebrated. The bare church, void of any decorations or even altar cloths and candles is a dramatic and beautiful reminder that without Christ we have nothing.

more children. Help us stand by our theme of "Receive and show mercy to others."


